Federal Hours-Of-Service Rules

Day

- A 24-hour period begins at the hour designated by the carrier
- · Minimum 10 hrs off-duty in the day.
- Maximum 13 hrs driving in the day.
- No driving after 14 hrs on-duty in the day.

Cycles

along solid black line

- Drivers must select one of two cycles:Cycle 1:
- no driving after 70 hrs on-duty in 7 days. Cycle 2:
- no driving after 120 hrs in 14 days;
- driver must take at least 24 consecutive hours off-duty prior to accumulating 70 hrs on-duty

Work-shift

- The total elapsed time between 2 off-duty hours is at least 8 consecutive hours.
- No driving after 16 hrs of total elapsed time in the work-shift.
- · Maximum 13 hrs driving in the work-shift.
- No driving after 14 hrs on-duty in the work-shift.

Deferring Off-Duty Time

- Drivers may reduce their off-duty requirement of 10 hrs by up to 2 hrs providing:
 - the 2 hrs are not part of the 8 consecutive off-duty hours on Day 1;
 the reduced time is added to the 8 consecutive
 - off-duty hours taken on Day 2;
 - additional 2 hrs are also taken on Day 2;
 - logbook clearly indicates "Deferral Used" and if 'Day 1' or 'Day 2'.

Federal Hours-Of-Service Rules

Reset / Switch Cycles

- A cycle can be reset or can switch cycles at any time by taking:
- 36 consecutive hours off to reset Cycle 1 or switch from Cycle 1;
- 72 consecutive hours off to reset Cycle 2 or switch from Cycle 2.

Off-Duty

• All drivers must take 24 consecutive off-duty hours every 14 days.

leeper Berth

- Same hours of service regulations apply for driving and on-duty limits;
- Work-shift limits on either side of each sleeper period are met;
- May split required off-duty hours into 2 periods if: Single Driver:
 - neither period is less than 2 hours;
 - total sleeper berth time is at least 10 hours in the day.

Team Driver:

- neither sleeper period is less than 4 hours;
- total sleeper berth time is at least 8 hours;
- total off-duty time at least 10 hours in the day.
