
Alberta Traffic Collisions - Driver Error 2015



In 2015, 86.4 per cent of total collisions involved one or more drivers identified as committing a driver error.

Other factors which contributed to the 140,705 reported collisions in 2015 were:

Driver condition – 2.9 per cent of total collisions involved one or more drivers identified as having a physical condition that contributed to the collision. 29.2 per cent of fatal collisions involved one or more drivers with a physical condition, which contributed to the collision.

Speed – 5.2 per cent of total collisions involved one or more drivers indicated by the police as having been travelling at a speed too great for the given conditions. However, 25.7 per cent of fatal collisions involved unsafe speed.

Vehicle condition – Only 0.8 per cent of total collisions involved one or more vehicles identified as having a vehicle defect which contributed to the collision.

Driver Condition includes: had been drinking, impaired by alcohol/drugs, fatigued/asleep or medical defect.

Note: *Does not include counter reported property damage only collisions.
