






#### **Collision Rates per 10,000 Population**



#### Casualty Rates per 10,000 Population








■ The Alberta seat belt wearing rate was 95.1% in 2011\* ■

Seatbelt users had a much lower injury rate (6.8%) than those not using seatbelts (22.4%)







■ 86.4 of total collisions involved at least one driver who committed a driving error


**Speeding Increases Collision Severity**


Involvement Rates per 10,000 Licensed Drivers






Involvement Rates per 1,000 Licensed Drivers Show...
