

Mandatory Ignition Interlock Device Program

Refusal to provide a breath sample continues to result in a charge under the *Criminal Code* (Canada) and an immediate suspension. The suspension will remain in effect until the criminal charge is resolved.

Begins after the driving disqualification period has expired for the following *Criminal Code* convictions:

- More than one alcohol-related *Criminal Code* driving offence within 10 years
- First alcohol-related *Criminal Code* driving offence and with a blood alcohol concentration of .16 or greater
- Refusal to provide a breath sample
