Completed Activities

Kidco has completed the utilities and earthworks.

The West Nose Creek bridges have been completed by PCL Construction Management Inc.

Project Status for Summer 2008

Traffic has been realigned at Country Hills Boulevard and is now utilizing the recently completed bridge. The current traffic configuration is Stage 1 of 3 stages. More information is provided in the Maps section.

Traffic at Beddington Trail and Sarcee Trail is currently being maintained on paved detours.

South Rock substantially completed the road surface construction between Country Hills Boulevard and Sarcee Trail. They are currently progressing with gravelling and paving between Sarcee Trail and Harvest Hills Boulevard. Street light construction is near completion in these areas.

Next Steps

South Rock will be progress with paving between Sarcee Trail and Beddington Trail.

Once Sarcee Trail and Beddington Trail bridges are complete, South Rock will connect the roads, complete the street lighting and signage and shift traffic onto the bridges. This is anticipated to occur in late September 2008 and may include limited closures of Sarcee Trail and Beddington Trail. No access to Stoney Trail will be permitted until late fall 2008.

South Rock's contract includes all pavement from Country Hills Boulevard NW to 15 Street NE, including mainline, ramps and cross streets. It also includes completion of grading, paving, underground shallow utilities, signs and lighting. This work will be undertaken over the course of 2008.

Construction Information

The complete earthworks include the future ramps and bridge fills for the expansion of the Shaganappi Trail Interchange. This will allow the interchange to be expanded much quicker in the future when traffic warrants and funding is available.

Stoney Trail will be a busy construction zone from now through 2008. Please do not enter as construction activities present significant hazards to the public.
