Deerfoot Trail / Glenmore Trail Interchange Functional Planning Study

The purpose of this open house is to present the plans for improvements of the Deerfoot Trail / Glenmore Trail interchange.

Members of the public are invited to learn more about this transportation planning study. The study will determine future upgrades to the Deerfoot Trail corridor at Glenmore Trail.

The ultimate goal is to develop a freeway to freeway connection at the Deerfoot Trail / Glenmore Trail interchange that will allow for the safe, efficient flow of traffic. The improved interchange will play a key role in Alberta's north-south trade corridor and the City's skeletal road network. At the end of the study, a functional roadway design will be developed along with a plan for near- and long-term improvements.

Representatives of Alberta Infrastructure and Transportation, The City of Calgary and CH2M HILL and TransTech, the consulting engineering firms conducting the study, will be present to answer questions and obtain your comments.

The material that will be presented at the open house on October 26, 2006 will include:

- Deerfoot Trail widening between Peigan Trail and Southland Drive
- Glenmore Trail widening between Blackfoot Trail S.E. and Heritage Drive
- Interchange improvements for long-term and near-term staging scenarios


