Completed Activities

Detail design and tendering are complete for Stage 1 of the Interchange. Stoney Trail is open to traffic with an at grade signalized intersection with Harvest Hills Boulevard. Aecom has been retained to plan, design and administrate interchange construction.

Stage 1 of the Harvest Hills Boulevard Interchange includes the construction of first of two bridges, the additional interchange ramps, the realignment of Harvest Hills Boulevard and the removal of the signalized intersection from Stoney Trail.

Bridge abutments and pier construction have been completed.

Project Status for Spring 2010

Bridge construction is anticipated to continue with fabrication of bridge girders and installation in late May 2010. Roadway construction started in late March 2010 with earthworks and storm water infrastructure. Gravel, paving and concrete curbs are anticipated to begin late May 2010. Roadworks will continue, weather permitting, until completion in fall 2010.

Next Steps

Bridge girders are anticipated to be delivered to site in late May or early June 2010. Grading and underground storm water utilities will continue. Production of overhead signs and street light poles will commence at the fabrication facility. Periodic lane closures may occur during the summer and fall as Westpro constructs the new ramps and bridge.

Construction Information

The original construction of Stoney Trail and the intersection included the future ramps and bridge fills for the expansion of the Harvest Hills Boulevard Interchange. This will allow the interchange to be expanded much quicker in 2010 and in the future (Stage 2) when traffic warrants and funding is available.

Stoney Trail and Harvest Hills Boulevard will be a busy construction zone in 2010. Please do not enter as construction activity areas present significant hazards to the public.
