The AGES Premium Silt Fence is manufactured with a woven geotextile fabric on wooden or metal posts. It is manufactured by Applied Geo Environmental Solutions (AGES) of Calgary.

The AGES Premium Silt Fence is used as a silt barrier, with high strength and high flow characteristics and its color (bright green) acts as a warning barrier. There are 3 high strength reinforcing strips running along the length of the material, so that it may be more securely attached to stakes, T-posts or wire fencing. This material is highly resistant to UV exposure, common soil chemicals and is non-biodegradable.
