Alberta Air Brake Program

All drivers of vehicles equipped with air brakes must complete the Alberta Air Brake Program in order to get a "Q" endorsement added onto their Alberta operator's licences.

How has the Air Brake Program Changed?

On May 15, 2012, the revised Air Brake Program was implemented with new content, instruction methods and evaluation techniques. One of the outcomes was that the air brake knowledge test was moved to Registry Agent offices.

To accommodate for this change in location, a new form, Notice of Air Brake Program Completion (DPLS0005), was created to replace the existing Notice of Drivr Education Course Completion form (TRANS0047 or DPLS0047) as the proof of having completed the Alberta Air Brake Program required to apply the air brake "Q" endorsement onto Alberta operator's licences.

Using Notice of Driver Education Course Completion Forms

If you have an air brake Notice of Driver Education Course Completion form issued prior to May 15, 2012:

- Until July 10, 2012, it may be used to add the "Q" endorsement onto an Alberta operator's licence at a Registry Agent office.
- After July 10, 2012, it cannot be used to add the "Q" endorsement onto an Alberta operator's licence. Contact the driver training school or employee driver training agency that issued you the form. They will work with Alberta Transportation to review your file.
