

Approved Alberta Transit Projects Funding Breakdown

Canada and Alberta support municipal public transit projects

The governments of Canada, Alberta and local municipalities have committed **\$934.6 million** in federal Public Transit Infrastructure Fund (PTIF) and provincial Green Transit Incentives Program (GreenTRIP) announcements.

Public Transit Infrastructure Fund

The Government of Canada is providing **\$346.4 million** for 111 public transit projects in Alberta's major urban and rural communities through PTIF. The Government of Alberta is providing more than **\$343.8 million** from GreenTRIP to these projects and others not receiving federal funding. In all, Alberta is funding 145 new public transit projects in 28 communities. Municipalities are providing **\$244.4 million**.

September 14, 2017 Announcement

As part of a fifth announcement of PTIF projects, the Governments of Canada and Alberta confirmed that the City of Edmonton Lakewood Transit Centre busway renewal project will receive **\$1.38 million** in federal, provincial and municipal support:

- **\$689,000** in PTIF funding from the Government of Canada;
- **\$344,500** in GreenTRIP support from the Government of Alberta; and
- **\$344,500** in municipal investment.

September 8, 2017 Announcement

As part of a fourth list of PTIF projects, the Governments of Canada and Alberta confirmed that three Alberta public transportation projects will receive **\$1.35 million** in federal, provincial and municipal support:

- **\$138,000** in PTIF funding from the Government of Canada;
- **\$903,333** in GreenTRIP support from the Government of Alberta¹; and
- **\$313,667** in municipal investment².

August 8, 2017 Announcement

The Government of Alberta and municipalities approved **\$1.48 million** in GreenTRIP and local funding for three projects in Canmore, Banff and Okotoks:

- **\$986,667** in GreenTRIP support from the Government of Alberta; and
- **\$493,333** in municipal investment.

July 5, 2017 Announcement

As part of a third list of PTIF projects, the Governments of Canada and Alberta announced that six Alberta public transportation projects will receive \$733,730 in federal, provincial and municipal support:

- **\$315,817** in PTIF funding from the Government of Canada;
- **\$317,288** in GreenTRIP support from the Government of Alberta¹; and
- **\$100,625** in municipal investment².

December 3, 2016 Announcement

As part of a second list of PTIF projects, the Governments of Canada and Alberta announced that 52 Alberta public transportation projects will receive **\$270.3 million** in federal, provincial and municipal funding:

- **\$132.9 million** in PTIF funding from the Government of Canada;
- **\$79.4 million** in GreenTRIP support from the Government of Alberta; and
- **\$58 million** in municipal investment.

The Government of Alberta announced an additional **\$156.5 million** in 37 GreenTRIP projects that are not receiving federal funding, with **\$79.2 million** coming from municipalities.

September 1, 2016 Announcement

\$424.7 million in funding was announced for 49 transit projects in Edmonton and Calgary: **\$212.4 million** from PTIF from the Government of Canada, **\$106.2 million** from the Government of Alberta from GreenTRIP and **\$106.2 million** from the municipalities.
