Allowance for Use of Electronic Images: International Registration Plan (IRP) Cab Cards and International Fuel Tax Agreement (IFTA) Licences

As of January 1, 2019, motor carriers will be allowed to carry their IRP cab cards and IFTA licences in electronic format. Motor carriers can choose to carry this documentation either in electronic or paper format in their vehicles.

The use of electronic images of IRP cab cards and IFTA licences have been accepted by all jurisdictions in the United States and Canada. Documentation shown in an electronic image must be accessible by computer, tablet, smart phone, or other electronic device.

If you choose to maintain an electronic format of this documentation, it is strongly recommended that the document is saved as a file, such as PDF, and saved to an electronic device for each vehicle. This approach enables you to have access to the documentation at any time, even when access to mobile and/or wireless service may be interrupted.

Regardless of the format (either electronic or paper), the document must be accurate, valid, legible, and be accessible on demand by request of law enforcement and/or the IRP Registrar. If you are unable to provide proof of credentials, then you may be charged by law enforcement, and court action may be taken.
